What if I am absent?

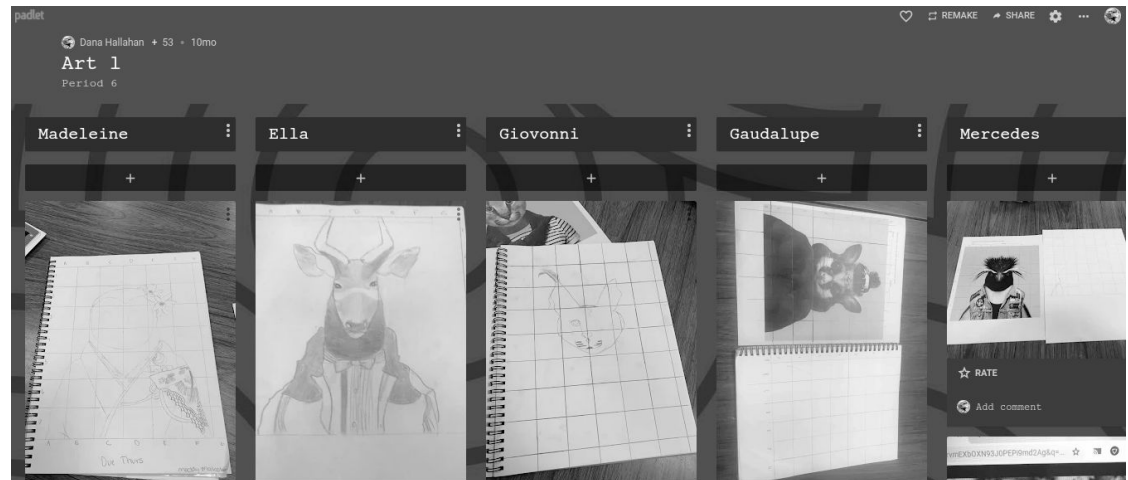

Otherwise, you'd have to photograph the work, email it to yourself and upload to the correct location. We will NOT use the chromebook to photograph work.

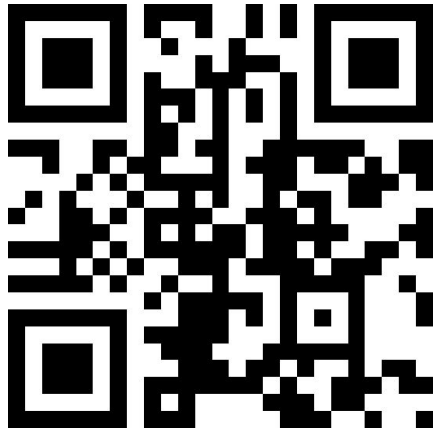

How to photograph your artwork to turn in.

Scan the QR Code for a video on photographing your artwork.

Photographing Your Artwork



Lighting: When photographing your artwork good lighting is extremely important. **Natural sunlight is best.** Try to take your photos in a room with lots of windows if you can.



If natural light is not available do your best to find a space with as much light as possible. Be careful of overhead lighting though. You do not want the shadow of your hands taking the photo in the picture.



Camera Angle:

Make sure the edges of your art work line up parallel with the edge of your camera frame. You **DO NOT** want the photo on an angle.



Edit: Before you submit your photo you want to **crop out the background** and adjust the settings so that the image best reflects your artwork
